Notes From the Pastor's Desk . . . November, 2024

All Saints Sunday... We will remember those who have gone before us in faith during the morning service, November 3. They now know the promise we journey toward in faith. Each person who will be remembered have left an indelible mark on our lives and countless others. Holy Communion will be celebrated as we remember the One who is Lord and Savior. The sacrament of the Lord's Supper is a "means of grace." God is present in this time and our souls are fed by Christ!

District Rally. . . Our Charge Conference will be held 3-5 PM this coming Sunday, November 3 at

Palmer Creek Campground in Harrison County - 14428 Campground Road. Why would I ask you to drive an hour for five minutes to approve the work of Nominations, Staff-Parish, and to approve a pastoral report on membership? I am not asking you to drive one hour to approve these reports. You will grow deeper in love and the faith will become a delight as you band with other believers.

I heard a story long ago about a young child being trapped in an apartment building way up on the 6th floor. There was a raging fire and no one could reach the child. This happened years before the big huge fire trucks with their huge ladders. Everyone stood listening to the child's cries and watch-

ing in horror as the building was engulfed in flames. One young man in the crowd could not stand the scene before him. He took one look at the situation and began to climb a near-by metal pole next to the building. He thought nothing of himself watching the small child in the window engulfed by flames. With great difficulty he climbed the pole and made it to the little child. He grabbed onto the child with such force, helped him on his back and started down that same metal pole towards the ground. This time though, the metal pole had begun to radiate with the heat of the adjoining building. The young man grabbed the pole and worked as hard as he could to bring the young child safely down. He finally made it! The crowd went wild, the mother of the young child grabbed her son and in all the excitement, the hero was pushed to the side. No one noticed him as he quietly limped away. His hands were burned and scorched so badly that he almost lost the use of them. It took weeks and months to bring healing to them. His hands were burned so horribly that permanent damage was done and permanent scarring. Yet, every time the young hero looked at his hands, he only thought of how grateful he was that he was able to save the little child. His hands told a beautiful story of grace given. He suffered, he gave, so that another might live. Grace (unmerited favor) had been given to someone he didn't even know. That fire changed two lives forever.

Life is about GRACE. We have a choice everyday to accept it or refuse it. We also have a choice to give grace or keep it for ourselves. That young man could have stood with the rest of the crowd watching the horrible events unfold or he could go into action and make a difference. He chose the latter. He chose to give grace, not just take GRACE. Moment by moment of our daily lives we have that same choice. We can accept the grace God offers us or refuse it. Then we have that same opportunity to bestow GRACE to someone or hoard it for ourselves. JESUS paid a precious price for us. Jesus scarred His entire body so we could have grace. When He looks at His hands, He sees us, not the scars. He loves us beyond measure. Yet, how many of us who have received this Grace, hoard it for ourselves and never bestow it to someone else? How many people do we pass everyday looking for a Savior? How many do we see looking for an answer? How many broken-hearted people do we just ignore? We have freely received a gift; we have been commissioned to freely give that same gift to others. When Jesus looks at His hands He sees us, when we look at our hands what do we see? Hands that reach out? Hands that pray? Hands that give? Hands that love? What do you do with the GRACE you have been given? In this broken and hurting world how do you make the world better? This month as we give thanks, let us be willing to offer Grace and love to those around us. Let us stop and freely give to those who need His love the most. We can be like the man in the crowd and give our all or we can be like the crowd and do nothing. I am reminded of the story in the Bible about the feeding of the 5,000. Jesus asked for the disciples to find someone who had some food. Out of all those people, there had to be someone else with a lunch. Yet, only that one little boy gave his 5 loaves and 2 fishes to Jesus and what a difference it made. But what if he had kept his lunch to himself? Jesus never forces us to give He just simply gives us the opportunity; the rest is left up to us. So, what do you do with the GRACE you have been given? What do you do with Jesus? There is someone out there needing you to choose to be a Grace giver.
