Notes From the Pastor's Desk . . . October, 2024

As I write this article, the Global Methodist Church's first General Conference is taking place. Reports from the Conference are very encouraging. The Spirit of God is moving through the delegates, volunteers, and attenders. A new movement of God is clearly at work, and we are privileged to be connected.

When the Global Methodist Church was launched and First Church of Lucedale voted to join, it was a fledgling denomination. The Mississippi-West Tennessee Conference had about 40 congregations, and there was uncertainty about whether we would be viable as a Conference. Every officer of the Conference was a volunteer. We had no budget, no checking account, no expense reimbursements. But we served with great joy, trusting in the Lord.

God is faithful. He is moving in a fresh way among the people called Methodists. I witnessed this last week at the New Room Conference. People were delivered from bondage, lives were given a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and the worship was incredible!

We trusted God, and God has proven to be faithful! Our Conference is now over 200 congregations strong. Our district is the largest in the conference and growing! Most importantly, the Spirit of God is moving among us, and people are coming to Christ. Christians are growing in holiness, and worship is vibrant!

The Word of God speaks much about trust. We launched out on a journey where the future was less certain, but we were faithful. Proverbs 3:5 tells us "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding." "Trust in God is a central imperative in Scripture. The verb used in Proverbs 3:5 occurs more than 100 times in the Old Testament. The writer does not define or explain trust. He does, however, describe what trust in God is not- it is not relying on our own understanding." (Rachel Coleman writing for Firebrand magazine)

Misplaced trust is a chronic temptation for our generation just as it was for the people of Israel and the New Testament church. Israel trusted in high walls and fortifications, political alliances, and military weapons. What's wrong with that? We want a strong military, secure borders, and strategic friends. Scripture speaks of the role of government being that of keeping order and protecting the integrity of the nation's borders.

Scripture tells us that our trust is to be in the Lord. We know that even the strongest armies fail, enemies find ways to penetrate borders, and alliances are fickle. Misplaced confidence is deadly. Gideon's army won the battle only when it pared down to a contingent too small to win apart from the hand of God. We have seen this at First Church. God has taken us through a season where we have had to rely upon Him. In the New Testament, the word "believe" is used to mean placing our confidence in the Lord.

As a nation, we are in a contentious political season. We are almost evenly divided. In times past, the vote may have been close, but at the end, we worked together to be a stronger nation. That time has passed. Christians must engage in politics, but our feet are not firmly planted there. We are planted upon the Rock that is Christ, not in shifting sand. Our hope is in the Lord. He is sovereign regardless of the outcome in November.

My prayer and confident hope is that the Lord will use the Movement we are grafted into to effect a change in our Nation so that many more will come to know Christ, and we will know a unity grounded in the One True God! Your brother in Christ,

2 Samuel 24:14:Let us fall into the hands of the LORD, for His mercy is great...

I heard a story some years ago about a family that had lost a precious loved one. After some months they decided to go through the terrible task of parting with their loved one's belongings. As they packed, they decided to check the pockets on some of the clothes. To their surprise, pocket after pocket contained hundreds of dollars. Hush money. Hidden money. Saved money, something to fall back on in a hard time. I also watched a story about a mother who saved every little speck of food she could: canned it, froze it and hoarded it for a day when food would be scarce.

My beloved great grandmother knew that I loved peas. So she would hide packs of peas in her freezer just for me. When Chrissy, the kid came to visit, she always had "fresh" peas and apple dapple cake. Something to fall back on, she used to say.

Whether we want to admit it or not, we all have something we fall back on. We keep a little secret, hide a little cash, store up for a rainy day or just have someone or something we can't live without. We all need a safe place to land in times of trouble.

King David needed a safe place to land. He had done the very thing God had told him not to do. He was told not to number his people. But David did. Why? Who knows? Maybe because he was feeling inferior and needed to see how many soldiers he could call into action. Perhaps he felt impowered, being sovereign and in control of His Kingdom. He disobeyed the Lord. He chose to willfully number his people and disobeyed the Lord.

God gave him a choice. David had all the resources in the world at his disposal. God asked him what he wanted his punishment to be. David answered; to FALL in the hands of Lord because His mercy is great. David knew that even though he had let the Lord down, God would not let him down. God would still be God and could still be trusted. God was just that to David, trustworthy. A safe place to fall.

My question today is what or who do you FALL back on? Is there something in your heart that makes you feel that if you hold on to it everything will be, ok?
