# Notes From the Pastor's Desk . . . December, 2024

Join us Sunday, December 1 as we begin the observance of Advent. Advent is from the Latin word "Adventus" and it means "coming" as in the advent of Christ. The season begins four Sundays prior to Christmas Day. This is also the beginning of the Christian liturgical year. We know the Word of God has been made flesh in Jesus. He is the fulfillment of prophetic words spoken by Isaiah, Micah, and others. "Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7 Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. 7 Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this." "Micah 5:2 But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days." Matthew 1 and Luke 2 record his birth as having taken place according to the prophecies of the Old Testament. When we express the life of someone who has died, we place a dash between the birth and death dates. The dash represents the years of their life. In the Word of God there is no beginning and end date, yet we live in the dash between the date of Jesus' birth and His glorious return. The season of Advent anticipates Jesus' first appearing as the "Word made Flesh" and His return.

We often speak of yearning for Christ to return in order to escape the problems of this world. That is not how people prayed for His first Advent. They yearned for our Lord's appearance to save them from evil, free from oppressors, and extend mercy to His beloved and judgment to those who hated God. But they longed most of all for His presence. Do we long for Jesus' presence in our lives? As He tabernacles within us, the beauty of holiness dominates our lives. We love what God loves and are no longer at war with our Creator. The purest form of joy is simply being in God's presence and being loved as we love Him. The return of Jesus promises this. There will be no more sorrowful tears, no death, and no war. It will be Kingdom living because He is in our midst!

Isaiah 55:9 says, "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts".


"If God's way of thinking is literally light years ahead of ours, we shouldn't be so surprised when He interrupts our plans with the unexpected".

Unexpectant surprises. Have you ever had one of those experiences? An unexpectant event which occurred that changed your plans but actually made it better in the end? I had one of those experiences the other day. An unexpectant surprise. It made me stop and realize that God was really right there beside me. He gently let me know that he knew where my feet were at that very moment. He also knew my very heart's cry. It was humbling.

I can't imagine what a young girl, barely 15, thought about when her unexpectant surprise came to her in the form of an angel's sweet words. Her surprise took her whole world by storm. It changed her life forever. I imagine though, she wouldn't have changed a thing. God called, she answered and everlasting eternity was given to all of us through the gift of her womb and her baby. She could have said no. God could have chosen someone else. Jesus could have decided a different plan was easier but He didn't. Joseph could have walked away. They all followed the Father's plan even when it was unexpectant to them. It did not take God by surprise. All the events unfolded just as the Father desired because they were willing to do the unexpectant.

In Children's Ministry, we have been talking about the Gift goes on.... the Gift of giving, the gift of the Father's love, the gift of Jesus' sacrifice and the gift of the Spirit's abiding presence. As we wind down 2024, it seems as if the clock goes faster and time runs away. Yet, God has unexpectant things for us if we take time to be still and listen. Mary had to listen to hear God speak, she couldn't panic. Joseph had to stay faithful even when he felt like he was facing unfaithfulness, the shepherds had to go off the beaten path, the angels had to leave glory to sing a message of hope, and the Wise men had to believe that this beautiful bright star was actually a sign - months before the Messiah ever came; unexpectant surprises that brought the greatest gift ever.

The Father gave His beloved Son, the Son gave us His life and the Holy Spirit and the Spirit gives us abiding life. Who could ever believe a tiny little baby would change the world for all generations to come? Who



could know what unexpectant surprise God was bringing into the middle of that dark night. God is infinite - we are finite. God is infallible - we are fallible. God knows it all, sees all and hears all. So maybe we should take a breath, halt in the middle of the madness and be pleasantly surprised by God's unexpected ways -- ways that are far higher than our ways and far better in the end. After all who doesn't love a surprise?


Thank you so much to all those who volunteered during National Collection Week. We collected a total of
